The Metal Trades Council of New London County is going to meet with Electric Boat Company for contract negotiations. The current contract expires on September 29th, 2023 and will be carried in full force until that date.

Nothing has been scheduled as of yet, but we expect meetings to begin within 6 weeks of the current contract end date.

In the near future we will be sending out surveys for you to complete, they are completely anonymous. It is just to get a better understanding of what you as a member are looking for from this new contract. So we can use this information as a guideline for the upcoming negotiations.

Your negotiating committee is unified, exploring every possible issue and is aware of its responsibilities to you.

Equally important, we believe a signed agreement will provide greater job security and stability for our membership while permitting Electric Boat to know its cost in time to successfully bid for new Shipbuilding contracts.

What should you do -

- 1) Support Union Leaders! Stand Strong Together.
- 2) Support our Strike Authorization Vote (Date to Follow).
- 3) Answer and submit your bargaining contract Survey.
- 4) Do not listen to rumors.

We will make every attempt to keep you informed of our progress. We believe in transparency but understand that it is a good strategy to not talk about expectations until they are agreed on. Please be patient. Thank you for Your Support During These Contract Negotiations.

INCREASE YOUR 401(K)

Regretfully most of you do not have a Pension plan for your future. You will be relying on your 401(K), therefore, this would be a great time to make a small increase in your 401(K) deductions. Years from now you will be thankful that you did.

UNION REMINDERS:

NEW HIRES YOU must stay on top of your insurance coverage. There are many choices for you to review and time limits for you to apply for these benefits. You are now eligible to join the insurance between days 0-30 of your date of hire. This is the only 30 days to execute access to the health plan. If you do nothing you will automatically get medical but will not receive dental, extra eye care, and additional life insurance. If you are married or married with children, they will not be covered. It is important to enroll as soon as possible. Do not be late.

I suggest that you call to make arrangements for health insurance since all calls are recorded. In the past, there were problems with online enrollments. There are many options to choose or reject. Your union negotiating committee has begun discussing the upcoming contract. Once we have created a questionnaire, we will get it out to the members. Please take your time in filling them out and return them as soon as possible.

As usual, I would like to ask my more senior members to please help the newer members around the yard. We're all brothers and sisters in this together. Let them know about the monthly meetings and encourage them to attend. Make sure they know who to contact if they need a steward as well.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS OF PHONE NUMBER? PLEASE inform a union representative. The company is not allowed to share this kind of information with us, so we only know if you tell us.

In case, there is anyone that does not know where they can check their paystub online, you need to login to your fidelity netbenefits page. On the home page, halfway down, click on the link titled "GD ESS". On the next page click "Go to GD ESS". This will bring you to the Employee Self Service homepage where you can find a link to your paystub.

INSURANCE UPDATE: If you are out for more than 30 days and need to pay insurance, the General Dynamics Service Center will mail you a form and instructions. If you do not receive this letter in a timely manner, please call (888)432-3633.

Before you retire, please contact the union, and let us know. You DO NOT need to submit a withdrawal card. Retirees can receive a union jacket and/or watch. 40 years or more will receive both. 15-40 years will receive a watch.

Make sure to inform the union if you will be out of work for an extended amount of time so that we can make sure your dues are adjusted.

If you are a Military Veteran, please see Christopher Wasilewski on first shift for support.

New Members: Between days 0-30 days after your date of hire you must log onto the General Dynamics Service Center website at www.gdbenefits.com to enroll yourself, and your dependents, in the benefits package.

As always, do not forget to use the safety boot and eyeglass program that was negotiated by the MTC. A list of the different shoe manufacturers and times that they will be outside the front gate is available. The eyeglass store is open on both the inside of the main gate and the outside entrance for your convenience, check bulletin boards for the times they are open.

IMPORTANT: If you are put on notice, going to be disciplined, or sent to Security to give a statement of any kind, you have the right to have a steward present. Your first words should be, "I want to talk to a Steward".

REMEMBER, YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO UNION REPRESENTATION, AND YOU DON'T HAVE TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS WITHOUT THIS REPRESENTATION.

IMPORTANT: Members who are out of work on any leave of absence such as Workers Compensation, Sedgwick short term disability insurance, FMLA, etc. it is your responsibility to pay your portion for medical, dental, and vision. You can be dropped from your benefits if you don't keep up your payments.

Please don't forget to notify the Union Hall (860-442-8281) if you change your address, phone number, or name. We need to have the correct information! When you notify the company of these changes they do not give the Union this new information. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

REMINDER: If you are out of work on compensation or accident & sickness insurance or any unpaid leave it is your responsibility to pay your dues. If your dues fall behind more than three months, your membership could be suspended. If you are out of work and have any questions regarding your dues, please call the Union Hall at 860-442-8281.

IMPORTANT: It is advised that you notify me one week in advance or as soon as you know when you will be returning to work from any Medical, Compensation or unpaid leave. The company doesn't know if you kept your dues paid up while you were out. It is important that I know your return date so I can submit a letter to the company to have your dues zeroed out under non collected. Once the company takes out your dues it will take me at least a month to return your money.



Dear Brothers and Sisters;

You all should have received a letter from our Union stating that there shall be Nominations for all officers of the Union to be held at the regular monthly meeting held on Tuesday, May 9th 2023 at the Union hall. The regular monthly meeting on June 13th is cancelled due to Elections being held that day. The Election will take place at the parking garage across from the main gate on Tuesday, June

13, from 5:00 AM to 5:00PM. All positions are up for election/ reelection. Per Article 25.4 of the International Boilermakers Constitution;" To be eligible for nomination and election of a Local Lodge, a member shall be: In continuous good standing in the International Brotherhood and Local Lodge of which He/She is a member for a period of at least two (2) years immediately prior to the time of His/Her nomination, excepting at the date of nominations in Lodges charted less than two (2) years there shall be no length of membership eligibility requirements." Eligibility to vote (Article 25.3, 25.6 and 27.2.1) "A member, to be entitled to vote in any Local Lodge election, must have been in good standing in such Local Lodge for at least two (2) months immediately prior to such date of elections as recorded in the office of the International Secretary-Treasurer." If you have any questions or concerns please come to the Union Hall. I have a copy of the Constitution.

The members surveys should be going out to the membership. This will help your negotiating committee to focus on what the majority of the membership wants in the upcoming contract negotiations. The current contract with the Company expires on September 29th, 2023. We are sitting in a favorable position for negotiations. The Navy needs our product ASAP and we need a GOOD contract ASAP! The Company is sitting on billions of dollars in contracts. It is time to share the wealth!

Article II violations. Non- bargaining unit employees, including supervisory employees, shall not perform work on any hourly rated jobs. This has been going on way to long. Human resources and Operation Directors say they are looking into the Article II violations. The Union is noticing little or no action is being taken. We strongly recommend that if you see a member of management doing our work, tell them to stop, or tell any Union Steward about the incident. The only way to fix this problem is to be a thorn in their side. If we keep bringing supervisors up to HR, they will get tired of seeing us and then maybe the problem will go away.

Please attend the next monthly meeting. The meeting in May should be a good one. Good luck to any and all who want to run for a position!

Insurance Update

During the Annual Enrollment Dependent Audit, which started on January 17, 2023, and ended on March 1, 2023, eight MTC members either did not respond or could not get the necessary document required in time. Therefore, your dependents were taken off our medical plans starting on March 1, 2023.

The only way for you to get them back on the plan is to wait until next year's open enrollment period or have a qualifying event. Examples of that would be a new marriage, divorce having a child or loss of a spouse. This opens up a 30 day window where you can re-enroll them.

As of May 31, 2023, I will be stepping down as the MTC Benefits Representative due to my retirement. It has been a long but rewarding run. Please join me in welcoming Janet Orr as my replacement and wishing her well. I'm sure she will do a great job.

> It seems my last article did not sit well with some employees. Now that I have your attention, please, all I ask is you follow the rules. Even if you're just passing through the 260 building your PPE is required. When stepping off the elevators onto the mezzanine or traveling the mezzanines, your PPE is required. When stepping past the PPE lines into the 260 building your PPE is required.

What PPE you ask. Hard Hat, Safety Glasses, Hearing Protection and Work Boots. Wouldn't hurt to be wearing your gloves as well. Don't walk around with your hands in your pockets. You might need them quickly to brace a fall or to help with balance or to hold onto a railing.

Also quick reminder, April 28th.is our Workers Memorial. We have had this since the early 90's. It's to remember those who have suffered and died on the job and to renew our efforts for safe workplaces. This year it will be.
